How to find ACCOMMODATION







Ask to see the contract, read carefully and do not forget to ask the rules of the house.

After making the payment, ask for a receipt and a letter from the landlord, confirming that You reside on the site.



How to find A JOB

All people, who come to study for 25 weeks in Ireland, have the right to work 20 hours a week throughout the year, except during the months from June to September and December to January, when they are released to work 40 hours a week.

The first step to look for a job and the elaboration of the CV, to assist in this process, Student Campus offers Workshops where teachers give tips and correct the students' CVs.


Looking for THE JOB

The most effective way to find a job and go in the establishments and drop off the CV personally. An important tip and go dressed in black clothes and deliver directly to the manager. If they likes your profile, they will ask you to do a test.

Another way is to follow social networks and job sites, www.job.ie & www.indeed.ie, always there are vacancies available.

What documents should I submit to the employer? When you find a job, the employer will request three documents:

- Passport
- PPS
- proof of address



What is THE PPS?

Public Personal Service Number (PPSN) is a record of public services, which can be used for various purposes. Without it, it is not possible to work legally in the country.

But the student doesn't have to worry about getting it out as soon as it arrives in the country.

When the employer decides to hire, he issues a letter requesting PPS. He only has direct to PPS who fits in the following situations:

- Being employed in the country;
- Have the water account in its own name;
- Request permission to drive in the country.






Process to GET YOUR PPS

Non-European citizens who need to withdraw PPS should schedule a time by www.mywelfare.ie. With the appointment made, the student must attend the Intreo Centre, located on Dominic Street, bearing the following documents:

- The passport and the
- proof of residence;
- Letter from the employer;

Public TRANSPORTS

Limerick citizens have several categories of public transport, such as:

Buses

The company Eireann is responsible for the bus lines that circulate throughout the neighborhoods of Limerick. In addition to the attractive prices of the tickets. The population has the right to take the Leapcard, top up card, which guarantees 30% discount. That's an excellent transport option.

Adult ticket – EUR 2.40

Passage with Leapcard – 1.68 euros

Students have the right to the Leapcard Student which in addition to ensuring the discount on tickets, also partnered with various establishments, offering discounts on meals and more.

STUDENT LEAP CARD. WHAT IS IT?

The Student Leap Card is a card that offers the student discount on bus tickets in several cities in Ireland such as Limerick, Galway, Dublin, Cork, Waterford, among others, and in more than 200 establishments, including McDonald's, Costa Coffee, Vodafone, Boots Pharmacie.

With the card, the student gets 50% discount on the Irish transport system.
